A word from your pastor....



My beloved church family:

March and April have been some of the busiest and most productive weeks of ministry we have ever undertaken. We hosted Touched Twice and disaster relief training for the Kentucky Bapt. Convention. We attended security training in Frankfort and co-sponsored an Easter outreach

among Indian nationals in Louisville. Our students and chaperones reached out domestically in conjunction with church planters in Baltimore, handing out 5,500 flyers for an outreach event that saw 400-500 in attendance. It has been a great time of ministry!

But even as we reflect on the opportunities for service afforded us, we must never forget the priority of prayer in the life and flow of God's plans for His people. After three years of intensive ministry and instruction of His disciples, Jesus said this: "Then Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and said to His disciples, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray." Matthew 26:36 (NASB77) Between the rigor of service and the climax of the cross, Jesus called His disciples to engage in prayer with Him.

We, like the disciples of another generation, need to heed this call to engage in intentional, focused prayer. We will be pausing on May 2 & 3 to do just that. Christians across America will pause to pray. Our theme will be unity. In a fragmented, increasingly hostile world of spiritual division, we must come together to rally around the cross. We live in a pluralistic society. I celebrate our freedom to hold a diversity of opinions which allows for us to worship as conscience dictates. However, I also join with you in celebrating the one place where true unity is potential - namely, the cross of Christ. The sinful adulterous woman, the pagan Roman officer, and the convicted thief found mercy, grace, hope and forgiveness in the presence of our Lord. The greatest needs of our world can be met when Jesus's teaching and the presence of the Holy Spirit come to bear. I hope you will join with me in prayer May 2-3, 2018. One taxing season of ministry has concluded. Now, we look ahead to foreign mission service, Vacation Bible School, and Summer Camps. We are called upon to minister here in Shelbyville as well as the ends of the earth. Pausing to pray is exactly what Jesus

SECURITY MATTERS


A new security policy was approved at the April 15, 2018 Business Meeting.

All doors will remain available for egress in the event of an emergency.

Once the 11:00 service begins on Sundays, only the entrance to the sanctuary facing the street and the south black awning glass doors will remain unlocked.

The doors which will be locked on Sundays beginning May 20, 2018 are at the following places:

- ⇒ East Entrance to the hallway between the choir room and sanctuary (Entrance #4)
- Entrance to the stairwell beside the black awning (Entrance #6)
- Sidewalk entrance nearest the children's studio area (Entrance #7)
- ⇒ West entrance outside the gym (Entrance #9)



We understand this may present some inconvenience, but safety concerns are paramount.


