FIRST RESPONDER WEEKEND

Our fourth weekend of events to honor Shelby County First Responders was held Sept. 7-9.

On Friday evening, the community was invited to meet their first responders, as we put a 200-lb. hog on the BBQ pit. An additional 164 lbs. of pork butts were smoked. First responders participated in a corn hole tournament with prizes and hundreds of hot dogs, brats and bags of popcorn were given away.

On Saturday, first responders were invited to bring their families to the church for a BBQ lunch. The group paused to remember the fallen with a special table in the gym in commemoration. More than \$3,000 in door prizes were given away to first responders, and 192 people were served.
